THE STATUS OF CARISSA LAXIFLORA BENTH. AND CARISSA PAPUANA MARKGRAF (APOCYNACEAE)

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SUMMARY

Carissa papuana Markgraf described from New Guinea is placed in the synonymy of C. laxiflora Benth. described from Australia. Carissa laxiflora occurs on Cape York Peninsula, southern New Guinea and adjacent islands.

During curation of the holdings of Apocynaceae at the Queensland Herbarium (BRI) it became evident that *Carissa laxiflora* Benth. which has hitherto been considered to occur only in Queensland, Australia, has also been collected in southern Papua New Guinea. Markgraf (1971) provided an account of *Carissa* in Malesia where he recorded *C. papuana* Markgraf as the sole representative for that region. Examination of the type material of *C. laxiflora* and *C. papuana* reveals them to be conspecific, and the latter name is here formally placed in synonymy.

Carissa laxiflora Benth.

Carissa papuana Markgraf, Nova Guinea 14 (1925) 278; Blumea 19 (1971) 149, synon. nov. — Type: W. B. Branderhorst 64 (U, holo), 13 Sept. 1907, Okaba, New Guinea.

Distribution. Restricted to Cape York Peninsula, Australia and the southern parts of New Guinea and adjacent islands.

Ecology. Plants grow in the foredune communities along beaches, behind mangroves and often in coastal vine thicket communities.
