Miss Nancy B u r b i d g e, C.S.I.R.O. Canberra, has been stationed at kew, Oct.1952-Oct.1954, as Australian liaison officer in botany at the Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew.

Mr J. C a r r i c k, M.Sc., originally of Glasgow University, who has been teaching since the war at Winnipeg University, has now been appointed lecturer in botany in the University of Malaya, Singapore.

Miss Ruth v a n C r e v e l has been appointed as draughtsman on the permanent staff of Flora Malesiana, March 1952.

Dr M.A. D o n k, Keeper of the Herbarium Bogoriense, Bogor, has also been appointed extra-ordinarius at the Faculty of Science of the University of Indonesia, Bandung. He was granted a year leave in Holland, August 1952.
